Purpose of Meeting

The purpose of the meeting was to consider First Reading of amendments to Chapter 33 – Solid Waste By-law.

Council agreed to add Relief Donation to Fort McMurray to the agenda.

First Reading – Chapter 33 Solid Waste By-law

Staff were directed by Council to review and amend Chapter 33 – Solid Waste By-law, with the intent to have a clause which would prohibit the exportation of solid waste generated within the County of Colchester outside the boundaries of the County of Colchester. Mr. Wayne Wamboldt, Director of Solid Waste, advised that additional amendments have also been made to include the addition of textiles and polystyrene foam in the definitions of recyclables.

“That Council approves, at First Reading, amendments to Chapter 33 – Solid Waste By-law, with one noted amendment:

- Change the wording from *the facilities* to *those facilities* in the latter part of the sentence of Section 5.”

Relief Donation to Fort McMurray

Due to the devastating fires in Fort McMurray, Mayor Taylor raised the issue of the Municipality making a donation to the relief efforts. Discussion was held about contributions to the Red Cross as well as other possible avenues such as Food Banks and United Way. Interest was expressed in a donation that would help people that are coming back home to Nova Scotia.
