Why MUST my Recyclables be clean?

Dirty recyclables contaminate clean ones.
At the Colchester Materials Recovery Facility, every piece of recycling is touched by a worker.
If it is dirty it slows the sorting process and if not removed, it lowers the quality of the material going to market.

How to dispose of corrugated cardboard





Corrugated cardboard can be set beside your blue recycling bags. It should be broken down and bundled in armload sizes approximately 3ft x 2ft x 1ft.

Materials must be curbside before 7:00 am on your collection day to ensure collection

One residential household is allowed:

Garbage

5 clear bags & 1 black bag for privacy (or 6 clear bags)

Recycling

12 blue bags



Organics

1 green cart



Two bulky items

For residents of the Municipality of Colchester & the Towns of Truro & Stewiacke one household can place two large items curbside on their regular garbage collection day. Example:





Sharps


- 1. Pick up a free Safe Sharps container at your local pharmacy.
- 2. Place your used sharps into the container.
- 3. When the container is full, return it to your local pharmacy for free.

Lab/Medical Waste

Most items found in the home for medical care should be placed in the garbage:

- Wound dressing
- Catheters
- IV tubing
- Trays
- Draining bags
- Gauze
- Incontinence products
- Tweezers

- Scissors
- Petri dishes
- Blister packaging

Illegal Dumping is the dumping of waste in the woods, on someone else's property or using someone's dumpster without permission.

Under the "Municipal Solid Waste Bylaw" an offender could face a fine of up to \$5000.

Construction & Demolition Waste



Asphalt Shingles

\$35 per metric tonne

(Asphalt shingles are ground into flakes for energy and traction sand).



Clean, Unpainted Drywall

\$35 per metric tonne

(Clean, unpainted drywall is added to compost. Drywall is high in calcium which is good for your soil).



Clean Wood

\$35 per metric tonne

(Wood is grounded up & marketed as an energy source).



Scrap Metal

\$35 per metric tonne

(Scrap metal is baled onsite & sold to be made into new material).

Disposing of these materials in dedicated loads will save you money!

Provincial Recycling



Plastic Bag Ban

October 30, 2020, businesses are not allowed to hand out single-use plastic bags at checkouts.

Remember to bring your own reusable bags.

Tire Recycling

You can return up to four tires 24.5 inches or less to any retailer in the province, free of charge. They must be off the rim and free of mud and debris. Leave used tires at the retailer when you buy new ones.



Safe Sharps Bring Back Program

Under this program, residents who generate sharps in their home can pick up a plastic 3 litre or 5 litre container at their local pharmacy. When the container is full, it can be returned to the pharmacy for disposal.



Used Oil

There are municipalities and local garages who will accept small quanities of used oil, used filters and antifreeze. There is no fee for this service.

Recycle My Cell

The goal of this program is to minimize the number of handsets entering Canada's landfills. Recycle My Cell links participating cell phone recycling programs together, making it easier for you to determine how and where you can dispose of your used wireless device.



Paint Recycling

The Nova Scotia Paint Recycling Program aims to bring new life to unused paint. Try to use the "BUD" rule:
Buy only the paint you need.
Use all the paint you buy.
Dispose of leftover paint safely.

Colchester County Enviro-Depots

Return beverage containers to your local ENVIRO-DEPOTS for a refund. Please ensure that caps are removed.

Enviro-Depots also accept leftover household paint (tightly sealed in its original container with the lid and label still readable).

NOTE: Milk cartons are NOT accepted at Enviro-Depots

These should be placed in your blue bag with containers recyclables and placed curbside for collection.





To book an appointment call **902-895-4777**

Each household is entitled to shovel **200kgs** of compost into six bags. Bags are provided but you can purchase **extra** bags at **\$2.00** per bag. Remember your own shovel and wear appropriate footwear and gloves.

Compost is available for bulk sale from our facility throughout the entire year! The cost is **\$35.00** per metric tonne. You are allowed to come out with your truck and trailer to purchase bulk compost.



Please ensure your material is visible for collection & that green carts & waste storage containers are free from ice & snow.

If collection is cancelled, residents will be informed by announcements on the radio, Twitter, Facebook, ReCollect Service Alerts & on our website at www.colchester.ca

When an alternate collection day is scheduled, notification is given during the cancellation announcement.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLCHESTER RESIDENTS



Leaves can be placed in your green cart for collection. Residents can place up to three (3) bags of leaves each collection day as long as the leaves are in PAPER leaf and yard waste bags.

TOWN OF TRURO RESIDENTS

The Public Works Department within the Town of Truro picks up paper bags of leaves from residents every fall.

Residents in the **Town of Truro** ensure your tree is placed curbside **before 7:00am on your collection day.**

All trees must be visible (unburied) & free of lights, tinsel, ornaments, stands and must be debagged to ensure collection.

Christmas Wrapping Paper



Wrapping Paper is **NOT** Recyclable

This is due to the large amount of dye within the paper & the contaminants that accompany it (tape, bows, ribbons etc.).

Wrapping paper should always be placed in your clear bag for garbage disposal.



To reduce waste you can use recycled wrapping paper or newspaper. You can make it look more festive by adding a sprig of evergreen or drawing on the paper.

The brown wrapping paper can go in your blue bag for paper or even your green cart for compost.
